 - Site Plan Review (current built area and total land area)
 - Current: 250,224 sf. 37% of area is built/parking. 63% green space
 - Scheme 7 (Sept 2017): 62% built/parking. Determined that this eliminated too much green space/playground area
 - New plan: 38,000 sf building (reduced by 3,300 sf from Scheme 7). Paving reduced to 84,000 sf. Parking area incorporates green space for drainage/infiltration of stormwater. Total property coverage with building/parking -49%
 - Soil boring (required to know where we can build) results: hit rock between 4.5 13 ft below surface. Subgrade is rippable. Do not anticipate much blasting for foundation requirements. No groundwater in any boring holes.
 - o Floor Plan Review
 - First Floor
 - Sanctuary total seating: 560. Current: 450
 - Need to determine how we want to use the Multi-Purpose Space (3,500 sf)
 - Able to kick a ball?
 - Concern: when entering the church during the week, there is difficulty in locating a person (pastor, staff).
 - Basement Level
 - Fellowship hall existing windows become wider openings doorways
 - Kitchen and choir rooms were strategically placed for ease of access from the exterior - less winding through the building
 - Second Floor
 - Becomes space for the daycare can be secured and separate from the rest of the church space on Sunday mornings
 - Multipurpose space could potentially add a small kitchen if there is interest in containing the daycare to the 2nd floor entirely
 - o Plan allows us to use the building while other areas are under construction/renovation

 - Words of appreciation were expressed for the many years of faithful service of Jean Herr who has retired from the Deacon Body.
 - The Greeting Chart and Deacon Members Sheet were passed and updated as deacons volunteered to be Sunday morning greeters for the months of 2018 and made any necessary changes in email address / phone number for the new Deacon Members sheet.
 - Lilli Ann Kopp has volunteered to join the Funeral Meal Committee as a member-at-large.
 - All deacons were encouraged to attend a training session, "Living with Persons with Dementia," to be presented by Joyce Stolzfus on Sunday morning, February 18, at 9:00.
 - Two deacons, Judith Gibble and Karen Ungemach volunteered to join Jobie Riley, Ken Chastain, and Roger Killian in delivering CDs of the Sunday morning service.
 - Lavonne Grubb resigned from assisting Jobie Riley in coordinating the Deacon
 Transportation Ministry. Gene and Barbara Ellis volunteered to fill Lavonne's position.
 - Vida and George Snavely expressed a concern that since they travel frequently, there are times they cannot be available for lead deacon duties. They suggested voting in a set of "assistant lead deacons." The deacons were in agreement. Barry and Sandy Garman were nominated, accepted the nomination, and received a unanimous vote.
 - All deacons moved into their new groups to volunteer for 2018 assignments. All assignments were filled and have been compiled to become a part of the Deacon Handbook for the new year.

Treasurer's Report

1. Review of Income Statement as of 12/31/2017

The congregation finished the year in very strong fashion, with December offerings of just over \$96,000. This was by far the strongest giving month that I've seen. For the year, revenue fell short of budget by \$40,102 (\$755,958 received versus \$796,060 budgeted). Revenue in 2017 was virtually the same as in 2016, as a small drop in offerings was offset by a larger facility fund transfer and slightly higher rent for the year. Regular offerings, at \$687,638, fell short of the budgeted offerings of \$727,760 by \$40,122, and were \$17,185 below last year's amount of \$704,823. A month by month summary of offerings is provided in the graph entitled "ECOB 2017".

A five year history of general fund offerings compared to budgeted offerings is also provided in the graph entitled "ECOB YTD 12/31 COMPARISON."

Disbursements for 2017 were less than budget by \$40,102 (\$755,958 actual spending versus \$796,060 budgeted spending) and \$9,204 higher than last year. This included a \$19,252 year end cost allocation to Resources' Capital Improvements budget line item of a portion of Greenfield Architects' cost associated with the building project. All Commissions' disbursements ended up under budget for the year, which offset the expected increased spending on salaries and benefits. The drop in Expressions budgeted spending was mitigated by \$15,100 spending from the M. O'Donnell Music Ministries Fund.

Overall, we ended 2017 with no operating income or loss, which compares to the \$9,164 operating surplus generated in 2016.

2. Long-term Investments with the Brethren Foundation

The market value of all long-term memorial funds invested with the Brethren Foundation as of 12/31/2017 was \$2,289,443, which is up \$214,674 from the beginning of the year market value of \$2,074,769, reflecting a \$47,199 contribution to the O'Donnell Music Ministries Fund, disbursements of \$79,447 from various funds, and an investment gain, net of expenses, of \$246,922 (a total investment return for the year over 11%). As of 12/31/2017 our portfolio was invested 82.0% in a balanced fund (60% domestic stock fund, 40% bond fund) and 18.0% in a bond fund, resulting in an overall approximate portfolio mix of 50% domestic stock fund and 50% bond fund.
